FHP Congressional Designation Process

- ACE Act requirement (Sec 204(g)):
 - (1) Designation review.—Not later than 5 years after the date of enactment of this Act, any partnership receiving Federal funds as of the date of enactment of this Act shall be subject to a designation review by Congress in which Congress shall have the opportunity to designate the partnership under subsection (f).
 - (2) INELIGIBILITY FOR FEDERAL FUNDS.—A partnership referred to in paragraph (1) that Congress does not designate as described in that paragraph shall be ineligible to receive Federal funds under this title.
- Recommendation to submit all FHPs seeking Congressional designation at one time to Congress.
- Board would submit template form that all FHPs have completed, a summary letter describing how all FHPs in the package meet the necessary requirements to seek Congressional designation.













FHP Congressional Designation Process

- FHPs would have from <u>June 13, 2023 to June 1, 2024</u> to do the following:
 - 1. Submit a draft application to the Board by December 31, 2023.
 - 2. Solicit Board feedback on application.
 - 3. Revise application & adjust FHP operations.
 - 4. Submit final application to Board (to be submitted to Congress).















FHP Congressional Designation Process

Potential Motion:

It is moved that the Partnerships Committee recommended process, timeline, and application form for FHPs to seek Congressional approval by 2025 be approved by the Board.















2. FHP/ Board Member Buddy System

- Board Members & FHPs could be paired
 - FHPs have a Board member point of contact
 - Board members have opportunity to gain understanding of FHP-level operations
- Partnership Committee is willing to develop this idea further and propose it at a future Board meeting if the Board is supportive.















2. FHP/ Board Member Buddy System

How it could work:

- 1-2 Board members assigned to each FHP, based on geography and expertise.
- Point of contact for Board Member's questions about FHPs in general or that FHP in particular.
- Option to sit in on FHP activities such as committee meetings, grant reviews, or other activities.















2. FHP/ Board Member Buddy System

Pros of the buddy system:

- Mutual relationship building.
- Board member opportunity to engage and learn more about specific FHP activities, operations, challenges, etc.
- Board member awareness of FHP context for Board activities and decisions
- Relationship & investment of time could be flexible & at the discretion of each Board member/FHP.
- FHPs gain a Board member point of contact.
